This is your chance to see Iceland's legendary puffins and whales up close and experience a land where modern life manages to coexist alongside active primordial forces of nature.

# Elemental Iceland Cruise: Day by Day

#### Day 1: Discover Iceland's Modern Capital Reykjavík

Start your expedition cruise in Reykjavík, a city rich in art and culture. We recommend exploring the city's highlights like the main street Laugavegur and Hallgrímskirkja Church. Board the MS Fridtjof Nansen, settle into your cabin, and enjoy dinner.

### Day 2: Charming Grundarfjörður

The quaint fishing town of Grundarfjörður lies near the majestic Kirkjufell mountain. Nearby is Snæfellsnes Peninsula National Park ('Little Iceland'), featuring the icecapped Snæfellsjökull volcano. Explore the park's diverse landscapes, including Djúpalónssandur's black sand beach, the Saxhóll crater, or a gigantic lava tube.

## Day 3: Ísafjörður

Explore Ísafjörður, a beautiful harborside town and gateway to the Westfjords, flanked by towering mountains. Stroll through the town to see historic architecture and shop for local handicrafts. Visit the Westfjords Heritage Museum, or take the hike up to Naustahvilft (the Troll's Throne) for stunning panoramic views.

#### Day 4: Akureyri and Goðafoss

Cruise into Eyjafjörður, Iceland's longest fjord and a prime area for whale watching. The fjord's base holds Akureyri (Iceland's 'Northern Capital'). Nearby, you can witness the picturesque Goðafoss waterfall and explore the active volcanic area around Lake Mývatn, where the Mid-Atlantic Ridge is visible.

#### Day 5: Húsavík and the Arctic Circle

Visit Húsavík, famous for its whale watching in Skjálfandi bay, often visited by humpback and minke whales. Learn more at the Húsavík Whale Museum. Húsavík is the gateway to northern highlights like Dettifoss waterfall and Ásbyrgi canyon. Later, we sail past Grímsey island, crossing the Arctic Circle.

#### Day 6: Bakkagerði

Explore the tiny, remote settlement of Bakkagerði, a place folklorically beloved by elves (huldufólk). This popular hiking area features lush valleys and colorful rhyolite scenery. In season, the coastal cliffs are home to fulmars, eiders, and puffins. We may visit the Hafnarhólmi Atlantic puffin colony, a gem for nature lovers.

#### Day 7: Heimaey

Discover Heimaey, the only inhabited island in the Westman Islands, which still bears the scars of a powerful volcanic eruption. Visit the Eldheimar museum to see an excavated home frozen in time. Hike to Stórhöfðito find puffins (nearly eight million nest here) or climb Mount Eldfell for incredible views of the town below.

# Day 8: Back to Reykjavík, Journey Home

Your expedition cruise concludes back in Reykjavík. Take this chance to enjoy the city at your own pace, seeing missed sights or relaxing in a traditional heittur pottur (geothermal pool). From here, your journey home begins.







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
