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Newfoundland & Nova Scotia Day by Day Itinerary

Day 1 (Aug 25) Fly to Halifax, Nova Scotia:

Your journey begins as a Globe Treks representative meets you at your doorstep in Western North Carolina. You'll board a flight to Halifax, Nova Scotia, where a Globe Treks luxury vehicle will be waiting to whisk you away to the luxurious Prince George's Hotel.

Day 2 (Aug 26) Peggy's Cove and Baddeck:

After a delicious breakfast, your exploration kicks off with a brief tour of Halifax and its modern harbor and city sights. Visit to iconic Peggy's Cove. With colorful houses perched along a narrow inlet and boats docked on the wharf, the picturesque village leading to the lighthouse is the quintessential East Coast landscape. Delight in lunch by the seaside before heading to Baddeck. As evening descends, unpack for a two-night stay at the Inverary Resort in Baddeck, nestled amidst the serene beauty of Nova Scotia.

Day 3 (Aug 27) Cabot Trail and Nova Scotia

Lobster Bake: Today you'll embark on a scenic journey along the legendary Cabot Trail, guided by a knowledgeable local expert. Rising from the sea and clinging to mountains, the Cabot Trail is a winding mix of roadway, paths, and stunning beauty that takes you from unreal ocean vistas to quaint fishing villages. As the day unfolds, enjoy a picnic lunch amid these breathtaking vistas. The evening is dedicated to an authentic Nova Scotia Lobster Bake, a culinary extravaganza featuring Cape North Mussels, regional delicacies, and of course, freshly caught lobster.

Day 4 (Aug 28) Ferry to Newfoundland: The Alexander Graham Bell Museum beckons this morning, offering insights into the life of this great inventor. We will also visit the shores of captivating Bras d'Or Lake. After a delicious lunch, board a ferry from Sydney to Port aux Basques, relishing the scenic wonders during the 6-hour journey. Arrive in Port aux Basques.

Day 5 (Aug 29) Gros Morne National Park:

Embark on a scenic drive to Cow's Head for a two-night stay at Shallow Bay, Gros Morne National Park. Marvel at the raw beauty of Gros Morne, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, where Mother Nature's artistry is on full display. The park, covering 1,805 square kilometers, is a tapestry of wonders, from towering cliffs to thunderous waterfalls.

Day 6 (Aug 30) Gros Morne Park Adventure:

Today's highlight is a boat cruise on spectacular Western Brook Pond. Behold this spectacular glacier-carved landlocked fjord, where waterfalls cascade over 2000 feet and often turn to mist before reaching the pond. Located in the long-Range Mountains, the most northern section of the Appalachian Mountains, this deep, 16-kilometer lake is home to Atlantic Salmon and an unusual colony of unusual colony of cliff nesting gulls.

Day 7 (Aug 31) Twillingate: Your journey continues with a drive to Twillingate, a charming coastal town renowned for its picturesque landscapes and iceberg sightings. Unpack at the Anchor Inn for a two-night stay, surrounded by the tranquility and beauty of Twillingate.

Day 8 (Sep 1) Twillingate: Immerse yourself in the lore and magic of the area, exploring lighthouses, parks, scenic harbors, and other highlights. Engage with the rich history and natural wonders of this enchanting region. Explore Iceberg Alley on an award-winning boat tour called Iceberg Quest. Marvel at 12,000-year-old icebergs, look for majestic humpback whales and watch elegant seabirds frolic along the coastlines. Relax as a friendly crew proudly introduces you to outport Newfoundland's way of life, charisma and hospitality.

Day 9 (Sep 2) Bonavista Peninsula: Embark on a picturesque drive from Twillingate to the Bonavista Peninsula. A stay at the rustic but comfortable, Harbor Quarters Inn awaits, offering breathtaking harbor views and access to the wonders of Bonavista. Explore the UNESCO Global Geopark, with sea stacks, caves, arches, and a Puffin Sanctuary behind the Cape Bonavista Lighthouse. The Discovery Geopark is a collection of 10 geologically significant sites including some of the best-preserved fossils in the world, dating back over half a billion years. The Discovery Geopark is not just about fossils, Elliston's root cellar history—influenced by the Area's natural landscape and soil composition—also contributed to the park's UNESCO status, as did the Devil's Footprints in Keels and the Sea Arch in Tickle Cove.

Day 10 (Sep 3) St. John's: Delve into more adventures at Bonavista in the morning before a scenic four-hour drive to St. John's. Your stay at the fabulous and modern Alt Hotel in St. John's blends big-city luxury with traditional small-town charm. Stroll through narrow, crisscrossing streets and witness the iconic Cabot Tower.

Day 11 (Sep 4) St. John's Exploration: Spend the day exploring St. John's with a local tour guide. Wander through the charming streets, marvel at colorful jellybean row houses, and visit Quidi Vidi, a village-within-a-city embodying the spirit of an old fishing outport. Explore Signal Hill, where Marconi received the first transatlantic wireless message in 1901 and discover the Basilica Cathedral of St. John the Baptist.

Day 12 (Sep 5) Journey Home: Fly out of St. John's back to the Carolinas, where a Globe Treks representative welcomes you back.
