Day 1 – Monday, November 9 – Tranquility Amidst Nature’s Majesty

Your getaway begins as a Globe Treks representative greets you at your door and assists with your luggage. Leave the mountains behind as temperatures warm and salt air beckons. Witness vibrant Autumn foliage as we descend from the mountains and enjoy a delicious lunch en route before arriving at The King and Prince Beach & Golf Resort, your home for the next three nights. Settle into your coastal-inspired accommodations, where colors mirror the sea and every window seems to frame sunlight. Take a quiet late afternoon stroll along the beach as the sky dissolves into shades of peach, rose, and lavender. Tonight’s dinner is at one of The King and Prince’s celebrated dining rooms, where fresh coastal cuisine and gracious service set the tone for your stay.

Life at The King and Prince

Perched along the sparkling shoreline of St. Simons Island, The King and Prince blends the charm of a historic seaside resort with the casual elegance of island living. Originally opened in the 1930s as a beachfront dance club, today it offers a world of comfort: sweeping ocean views, broad verandas, crackling fireplaces, and guest rooms filled with warm light and refined coastal décor.

Step outside your door and you’re greeted by the rhythm of the waves. Wander palm-lined pathways, relax beside oceanfront pools, or simply sit with a cup of coffee as pelicans glide over the water. In the evenings, soft lantern light glows against stucco walls and the scent of the sea drifts across the terraces. Life at The King and Prince invites you to slow your pace, breathe deeper, and savor the timeless beauty of the Georgia coast.

Day 2 – Tuesday, November 10 – Jekyll Island’s Coastal Splendor

After breakfast overlooking the Atlantic, we set out on a memorable shrimp boat eco-cruise aboard the Lady Jane. Watch the nets rise from the water as Captain Cameron and his crew introduce you to the creatures of the Marshes of Glynn: blue crabs, shrimp, flounder, rays — and perhaps a dolphin or two. Following a seafood lunch, we explore Jekyll Island, once the winter playground of America’s wealthiest families. Walk beneath ancient oaks and past the grand cottages of Millionaires Row, where the Rockefellers, Morgans, and Vanderbilts once gathered in quiet luxury. Return to St. Simons this evening for a relaxed and delicious dinner at a delightful Golden Isles’ establishment.

Day 3 – Wednesday, November 11 – Coastal Charms of St. Simons Island

Today is devoted to the history and beauty of St. Simons Island. Begin with a visit to the St. Simons Lighthouse, where those who wish may climb the spiral staircase to breathtaking ocean views. Wander the charming Pier Village, browse boutiques, and enjoy the easy pace of island life. Our afternoon includes Fort Frederica National Monument, where General James Oglethorpe defended the British colony in the 1700s, and the World War II Home Front Museum, which honors the region’s vital role in wartime shipbuilding. Along the way, we encounter traces of Gullah-Geechee culture, whose art and traditions continue to enrich the Golden Isles. Return to The King and Prince for a final evening of ocean-view dining — a perfect close to your island stay.

Day 4 – Thursday, November 12 – Savannah & the Journey Home

After breakfast and a final morning walk on the sand, we depart for Savannah, where moss-draped oaks, gracious squares, and stately architecture reveal the city’s timeless beauty. Enjoy a guided orientation and a delightful Sunday-style brunch before beginning our journey home. By early evening, a Globe Treks representative returns you to your doorstep — relaxed, refreshed, and perhaps with a tan on your face and a few grains of St. Simons Island sand still in your shoes.

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
