Experience a Hurtigruten voyage onboard the newly renovated 500-passenger MS Trollfjord deep into the Arctic Circle and the Land of the Midnight Sun. Relive pioneering adventures on a magical sailing experience along the Norwegian coast up to the edge of the world. This journey offers a unique itinerary to the Far North of Svalbard, providing ample time for exclusive excursions in 16 carefully chosen destinations along the Norwegian coast. We will go deep into remote fjords, visit the northern gateway of Tromsø, stand at the North Cape, and sail past the remote cliffs of Bjørnøya. Each day reveals wilder landscapes and brighter skies until we arrive in Longyearbyen, the gateway to Svalbard's wildlife, history, and dreamy landscapes. We recommend you join us for our land-based Norwegian pre-tour. The pre-tour starts in Oslo then onto one of the world's greatest train journeys across Norway's interior including the fjord town of Flåm then finishing up in coastal Bergen.

Norwegian Coastal Cruise: Day by Day

Day 1: Sailing The Svalbard Line


Welcome to Bergen, Norway's 'City of Seven Mountains' and the starting point for your voyage. Explore the historic, UNESCO-listed Bryggen quarter and the famous fish market near Vågen Bay. Before departure, visit the Bergen Terminal lounge to check for optional excursions. Aboard the *MS Trollfjord*, you'll settle in, enjoy your first meal, and begin your journey into the Norwegian Sea.

Day 2: Andalsnes Alpine Village by the Fjord

Located along the Isfjord, the small, picturesque town of Åndalsnes is a hub for outdoor activities. Experience the best views by hiking to the Rampestreken viewpoint, taking the Romsdal Gondola, or traveling the scenic Trollstigen Pass. Enjoy the surrounding peaks and fjords (Isfjord and Romsdalsfjord) from every angle.

Day 3: Træna, Norway's Oldest Fishing Community

The Træna archipelago, located on the Helgeland coast near the Arctic Circle, features approximately 500 islands. Enjoy local culture as the village opens exclusively for us, allowing visits to the church, museum, and more. Later, we will cross the Arctic Circle onboard and celebrate with a fun ceremony.





Day 4: Reine, The Tip of Lofoten

Today, we arrive at the famed Lofoten islands, recognized by their steep mountains rising from the sea. We dock in Reine, a picture-perfect fishing village famous for its red rorbuer. Nearby, you can take an optional excursion to Å, a traditional, well-preserved fishing village that houses the Norwegian Fishing Village Museum, focusing on the area's fishing history.

Day 5: Tromsø, Gateway to the Arctic

Tromsø, Northern Norway's urban Arctic hotspot and historic "Gateway to the Arctic," offers a full day of exploration.

Optional excursions include a city walk on polar history, visiting the Arctic Cathedral, or taking the Fjellheisen Cable Car up Storsteinen Mountain for fjord and city views.

Day 6: Honningsvåg, At the top of Europe

Around mid-morning, we arrive at Honningsvåg, the northernmost city in mainland Norway and the gateway to the North Cape. The North Cape plateau, Europe's northernmost point, soars 307 meters above the sea. Optional excursions include a bus or quad ride to the North Cape, hiking with the Expedition Team, or a local life introduction. As we sail away, we will enjoy views of the plateau from the sea as the ship heads into the Barents Sea.

Day 7: Towards the Arctic frontier

As we cross the Barents Sea toward Svalbard's remote wilderness, the theme of the day is the "Arctic desert," featuring a special talk on Svalbard and a culinary tasting prepared by the chefs on deck. Watch for the rugged Bjørnøya ('Bear Island') as we sail past, and in the afternoon, we will visit Ny-Ålesund.

Day 8: Longyearbyen, Arrive at the Edge of the World

On this final day, we arrive at the Svalbard archipelago and the island of Spitsbergen, characterized by its Arctic tundra and mountains. In the early afternoon, we dock in Longyearbyen, Svalbard's largest settlement and a former coal mining colony that now hosts the Global Seed Vault.
