Alaska's Inside Passage: Day by Day

Day 1: Pre-night in Seattle

We begin in Seattle. You can head to the top of the Space Needle, enjoy Pioneer Square, watch fish-tossing in Pike Place Market or browse the Seattle Art Museum. Take in the groovy Experience Music Project or the Pacific Science Center. Dive into the sea at the Seattle Aquarium or take to the skies at the Museum of Flight.

Day 2: Board Oceania Riviera

The *Oceania Riviera* reflects a new level of elegance through designer touches. She features multiple gourmet restaurants, including the La Reserve by Wine Spectator and the private dining venue, Privée.

Day 3: Oceania Riviera at Sea

A day at sea gives you the opportunity to settle in while enjoying activities on board: read in the library, attend a wine tasting or practice on the putting green.

Day 4: Ketchikan, Alaska

This day we are at sea. Ketchikan is famous for its totem poles, with the best viewing spots being Saxman Village and Totem Bight State Park. For a deeper understanding of the local cultures and ecosystems, visit the Southeast Alaska Discovery Center.

Day 5: Juneau, Alaska

Despite being a state capital, Juneau retains a lovely small-town charm, largely because its surrounding wilderness makes it accessible only by sea or air. Be sure to explore the Alaska State Museum to see collections from the indigenous people. For an unforgettable experience, don't miss Mendenhall Glacier.

Day 6: Sitka, Alaska

Sitka showcases a rich multicultural heritage. The city boasts two dozen sites on the National Register of Historic Places, including Castle Hill and Building 29, a Russian-built structure dating back to 1835. Furthermore, the Sheldon Jackson Museum houses one of Alaska's oldest collections dedicated to native culture.

Day 7: Haines, Alaska

Nestled along America's longest fjord - the Lynn Canal - Haines was first settled by Tlingit Indians. Totem poles are sprinkled about town, and artifacts from the Tlingits and the early pioneers are displayed in the Sheldon Museum. Brown bears, moose and bald eagles are plentiful.

Day 8: Icy Strait Point (Hoonah), Alaska

Hoonah, "where the north wind doesn't blow" in the Tlingit language, is a village situated on the sheltered side of Chichagof Island; Tlingit Indians comprise about 70% of its population. Visitors should keep a close watch for wildlife—look for bears, eagles, and humpback whales.

Day 9: At Sea

More time to refine your skills at The Culinary Center (the only hands-on cooking school at sea) and the Artist Loft. Relax at the Aquamar Spa + Vitality Center or join a trivia contest or bridge tournament.

Day 10: Wrangell, Alaska

Wrangell has a history marked by dramatic shifts, serving at different times as a Tlingit Indian stronghold, a Russian outpost, and finally an American settlement in 1867. Be sure to visit the tribal house on Chief Shakes Island and the area's three gold rushes at the Wrangell Museum. You can also observe the ancient petroglyphs carved into the rocks along the beaches.

Day 11: At Sea

Relax on board and enjoy the luxury suites and staterooms, dining venues, activities, and other special features.

Day 12: Vancouver, Canada

By far the largest port on our Alaska cruises, Vancouver offers every big-city attraction. Explore the Museum of Anthropology and the Vancouver Art Museum for culture. History flourishes in the Gastown district, which borders Chinatown. Or enjoy a break in Stanley Park, one of North America's largest urban parks. Start your journey home!
